A bowl barrow is a burial mound used to cover a tomb. This type of burial was used in the Neolithic (4500-3000 BC) to Late Bronze Age (3000 - 1200 BC). Its name comes from its appearance resembling an upturned bowl.

Legend has it that King Charles I was reviewing his troops from the Bowl Barrow during the Civil War in 1642! This is said to be how Kingstanding was given its name.
